God's One Amendment to Torah

Let us pray.

BAR-CHU et Adonai ham'vorach. Baruch Adonai ham'vorach l'olam vaed. Baruch atah, Adonai Eloheinu, Melech ha-olam, asher bacher banu mi-kol ha'amim, v'natan lanu et Torato. Baruch Atah, Adonai, notein ha Torah.

BLESS ADONAI who is blessed. Blessed is Adonai who is blessed now and forever. Blessed are You, Adonai, our God, Sovereign of the universe, who has chosen us from among the peoples, and given us the Torah. Blessed are You, Adonai, who gives the Torah.

Isaiah 40:3 A voice of one calling in the wilderness, "Prepare the way for the Lord".

These are the very last of days, the days of preparation for the coming of Messiah and God's Kingdom on Earth. God has called us to Repent from the Doctrines of men. God's people the Jew's follow Torah but have added greatly to it with the Talmud and other teachings. They need to return to Torah alone. God's people the Christians have Torah written in their hearts because they have accepted Jesus Christ who is the Living Torah into their heart. But they have practiced a separatism from Old Testament law and are sometimes ignorant of Torah. They need to amend this.

Many Christians believe that Jesus came to do away with the law of Torah. He did not, He is Torah. But, in the New Testament God did make one amendment to Torah.

Acts 10:9-16 About noon the following day as they were on their journey and approaching the city, Peter went up on the roof to pray. He became hungry and wanted something to eat, and while the meal was being prepared, he fell into a trance. He saw heaven opened and something like a large sheet being let down to earth by its four corners. It contained all kinds of four-footed animals, as well as reptiles and birds. Then a voice told him, "Get up, Peter. Kill and eat." "Surely not, Lord!" Peter replied, "I have never eaten anything impure or unclean." The voice spoke to him a second time, "Do not call anything impure that God has made clean." This happened three times and immediately the sheet was taken back to heaven.

We see that with Peter's vision God repealed the Kosher laws in Torah. God changes his rules for what man can eat four times in the Bible. In the beginning God said, "I give you every seed-bearing plant on the face of the whole earth and every tree that has fruit with seed in it. They will be yours for food." (Genesis 1:29). Then after the flood God tells Noah, "Everything that lives and moves about will be food for you. Just as I gave you the green plants, I now give you everything." (Genesis 9:3). Then in Leviticus Chapter 11 God establishes the Kosher laws. And finally as we see in Acts 10:9-16 God says that he has made all animals clean.

So, even though Christians follow Torah in their hearts through Christ and are not obligated to follow Torah on a physical daily basis, many Christians have done so. But one of the problems Christians have while trying to follow Torah literally is the Kosher laws but do not worry, these have been repealed already.

Matthew 11:29,30 Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light.

Christians, I believe you will find that when you follow Torah you will be following your heart.
